MNS 102	Mathematics 2 (Trigonometry)	Study of the definition and basic concepts in trigonometry, trigonometric functions, sum formulas, trigonometric equations and calculations with inverse trigonometric functions.
MNS 103	Natural Science 1 (General and Inorganic Chemistry)	Study of the fundamental principles of chemistry that include discussion of chemical properties, relationship and mechanism of chemical change, quantum theory, electronic structure of atoms, periodic relationship among elements and basic concept of solution and its stoichiometry.

HSS 104	Philosophy 2 (Ethics)	Study of the principles of conduct governing an individual's attitude demonstrated through ethical conduct, beliefs, and values integrity which deal with self-image and corruption, justice which comprises might vs. right, and perception vs. reality.
HSS 105	Philippine History	Study of the contributions of regional studies and global processes to social change; the relevance of the Philippine workings in relation to Asian countries; colonial and post colonial Philippine society; and the important aspect in understanding the modern transformation in Philippine history and culture.
HSS 307	Basic Economics with Taxation and Agrarian Reform	Study of the basic concepts of economics; microeconomics; the law of supply and demand; product markets; the distribution of income; taxation; and the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Law of 1988 as amended.
HSS 308	Life, Works, and Writings of Rizal	Study of the major contributions of Rizal to present social thoughts, politics and education; continuing relevance of Rizal's ideas raised in his two books, the "Noli Me Tangere" and "El Filibusterismo"; his legacy in the development of nationalism and

		humanism influencing the contemporary times; and the critical analysis of his other literary works.

Subject Code	Subject Title	Description
CPS 102	Criminal Justice System	Study of the Criminal Justice System in the Philippine setting which gives emphasis on the following but not limited to: nature and goals of criminal justice system; the five (5) components of criminal justice system namely: law enforcement, prosecution, court, correction, and the community; the Shri-a Law; and the current issues and concerns in Philippine criminal justice system.
CPS 103	Fundamentals of Criminology	Study of crime as a social phenomenon including the causes and consequences of crime; development of criminal behavior; causes and other aspects of crime; and the difference of criminology and other criminal justice and its components including police, courts and corrections.
CPS 104	Management 1 (Fundamentals of Management)	Study of management; its historical development; the five (5) management functions: planning, organizing, leading, coordinating and controlling; organization theories; organization theories; organizational structures; and organizational development.
CPS 210	Law 2 (Criminal Law 2-Book 2)	The analytical study of articles 114-367 of the Revised Penal Code (as amended) and analytical study of relevant cases.
CPS 211	Criminalistics 3 (Forensic Ballistics)	Scientific study of firearms powder, propelled weapons, missiles and explosives. Topics include: techniques in identifying cartridges, casing and bullet; bullet markings; and the use of instrumentation and equipment in ballistics examination.
CPS 212	Criminalistics 4 (Forensic Medicine)	Study of the medico-legal aspects; the nature and causes of death, impotency and sterility and poisoning; the nature and characteristics of wounds; post mortem examinations; and autopsy demonstration.
CPS 213	Criminalistics 5 (Polygraphy)	Study of the historical development, the instrument and its parts, the examination room basis for lie detector tests, qualification of examiner, factors affecting test results and legal status of lie detector test results.
CPS 214	Criminalistics 6 (Questioned Documents with Photography)	Scientific study of questioned documents; the procedures of detecting proof of forgery; types and writing materials; procedures of restoring writing; deciphering erasures and obliteration; the use of UV rays, infrared radiation, colored powders and visible lights

		in examining QD and the principles in using instrumentation on QD.
CPS 215	Statistics (Descriptive and Inferential)	Study of the basic statistical concepts and operations; collection of data with Measures of Central Tendency and Dispersion; tabular and graphical distribution of data; coefficient correlation; chi-square; and ANOVA.
CPS 209	Politics and Governance with Philippine Constitution	The subject deals with the study of the 1987 Philippine Constitution; the territorial jurisdiction of the Philippine; the declaration of the principles and state policies; the fundamental rights and freedom; enumerated in the Bill of Rights; and the right of suffrage. It also includes the study of the three branches of the government; the legislative department; executive department and the judicial department; the provisions on the constitutional commissions; the accountability of public officers; and the general provisions.
CPS 318	Law 4 (Criminal Procedure with Moot Court)	<p>The study of the following but not limited to; the rules of criminal procedures; prosecution of offenses; rights of the accused; and procedures of search and seizure.</p> <p>The subject is the study of the following: demeanor before trial: demeanor inside and outside the courtroom; relationship with the parties; use of notes; questioning; common cross-examining techniques and duties in orderly court.</p> <p>Mock Court shall be the practical exercise of the subject.</p>
CPS 323	Research 2 (Thesis Writing with Oral Defense)	<p>Study of the principles of participatory research; the framework for analysis of participatory research projects; the characteristics of a social research; methodologies used in social research; and the criteria choosing a research area.</p> <p>A defended/approved Chapters 4 and 5 is a requirement of the subject.</p>
CPS 324	Arson Investigation	Study of fire-damaged physical evidence and crime scene to detect an arson; techniques involve in arson investigation; chemistry of explosives and materials used in the formation of explosives, the various ways in which explosives are interrelated and initiated; and the Arson Law.
CPS 325	Basic Intelligence	Study of the intelligence cycle; cover and concealment; sources of information; and processes in handling information and informants.
CPS 326	Management 3 (Police, Fire, Jail)	Study of RA 6975 as amended; the legal mandate; functional and organizational

	Organization and Administration)	structure; program thrusts; and major programs of the PNP, BJMP, and BFP.
CPS 327	Public Safety Contemporary Issues and Problems	Study of the problems besetting the community (i.e. crime, vice, gambling, drugs, and prostitution, etc.). Methods and strategies in confronting issues and problems; and Efficiency and effectiveness of Public Safety Services sector in dealing with contemporary issues and problems.
